Reasons for Developing a National Standardization Strategy

- Buy-in by the Board of Directors
 - to define Strategy for Standardization of the Bureau
 - Useful for resource mobilization BoD's role
- Action item in Bureau's Strategic Plan 2015 2019
- National Quality Policy of The Gambia
 - Policy option for effective standards development

ISO Support and Contribution

- Training of Staff on development of NSS
 - 2 trainings provided fully funded
 - Materials and tools made available
- Expert support throughout the process
 - Guidance and coaching

Difficulties and how they were overcome

- Stakeholder feed back on questionnaire
 - Step down training of stakeholders
 - Site visits and meetings
 - Follow-up and follow-up...!!
- Pre-validation meeting of stakeholders
 - Review questionnaire submissions
 - Clarifications
 - Engagements to build confidence and buy-in

Difficulties and how they were overcome

- Prioritization and balancing interests Bureau's leadership and expertise
 - Which standards for what year?
 - How many in a year?
 - Limitations e.g., resources, capacity
- Limited awareness on standardization
 - Sensitizations on value of the NSS
 - Leveraging on TCs

How Useful is the NSS

- Standardization program is easier to develop and more coordinated
- Decisions on setting priorities on standards are more efficient and realistic – National and Regional
- Better rationalisation of cost of Standardization
- Good tool for advocacy Policy and others
- Better overview of Standardization needs, trends and focus
- Tool for resource mobilization

Implementation challenges

- Unplanned requests to develop key/urgent standards
 - Government
 - Projects
- Budgetary fluctuations
 - e.g., Government-funded NSBs
- Changes in commitment from stakeholders
- Impact of regional Standards harmonization

Conclusions

- Process is easy as it is well supported by ISO
- Should be the basis for Standardization
- Effective tool for resource allocation
- Useful to embed it in National Quality Policies
- Effective in linking and creating relevance of Standardization in national development
